2. Public comment(s) On any Items on the Agenda

- a. Tracy noted that Action Inc offers coordinated entry for housing opportunities and will likely work with CCCS's new grant. Pre-COVID Action had 32 people on the coordinated entry list, currently having 92.

3. Old Business

- a. Discuss and vote on by-laws
 - i. Jamie Vanderlinden moved that we accept the bylaws as revised 4-21-21, Karen Sullivan seconded, motion carried with 2 (two) proxy votes from members with lived experience not present at this meeting

4. New Business

- a. Kathy Dunks provided an update- CCCS, in collaboration with BSB, received \$25,000 (to be spent by November 2021) to help find housing, clothing, cover medication co-pays, and care coordination from pre-trial to release for people justice involved individuals in BSB. The funding limit is \$500pp and individuals must be on probation/parole, in pre-trial, or otherwise involved with the DOC. Applications can be obtained from Kathy Dunks at 496-1169
- b. Montana's Peer Network would like to present for 15-20 minutes to the BSB BHLAC next month. Discussion was had around the time to grant them with the council's consensus being 10 minutes for a presentation with 5 minutes for questions and discussion to follow.

- c. BSB BHLAC Email Address- Bill Deavel stated the need for a standing email address which could be forwarded to LAC members. Demetrius Fassas noted that Karen Sullivan's information is the contact currently presented on the website, and he will follow up with BSB IT to inquire about setting this email address up. Voting on the creation of this email address and members to forward it to will be on the May agenda.
- d. AMDD Wish List
 - a. Discussion was had around the potential funding opportunity that this list will inform. It is thought that there is potential funding for a large project, and that this will inform development of an RFP.
 - i. Low Barrier Detox Center
 - 1. MCDC provides social detox, and refers people to St. James for medical detox, but neither provides
 - ii. Mobile Crisis Team expansion
 - 1. Kathy noted that law enforcement would like to track the utilization of the CRT's, Care Coordinators, and Case Managers before expanding a dedicated mobile crisis team in BSB. The estimated price tag for 24/7 coverage is ~\$450,000/yr
 - iii. Recovery Center (Peer run drop in center)
 - iv. Peer Respite Center (for individuals not meeting requirements for crisis stabilization)
 - 1. A model was created in Oregon, basically providing low barrier 72 hour crisis support for individuals not meeting the need for traditional crisis stabilization services.
 - v. Trainings & Community Education- eCPR
